Dear Friends,

A Happy Mother's Day to all our mothers, grandmothers and godmothers. May the Lord bless you abundantly.

Thank you to all who picked up their envelopes in the back of church last weekend. The envelopes contained a booklet of Catholic prayers and general information as well as letters announcing a celebration of our 5 years as a parish and an invitation to participate in electronic communications from the parish. Those unable to pick up their envelopes last weekend are invited to do so this weekend. Also, thank you to everyone for your generous support of the parish in this year's Easter Collection, which was \$14,066.

A discussion arose at a recent Pastoral Council meeting concerning the 5 PM Sunday Mass, which is consistently the least attended of the 4 Masses we have on the weekend. Last Sunday was typical. Mass began with about 45 people in church, but by the time I finished preaching my homily, the number of attendees doubled. When I celebrate the 5 PM Sunday Mass, it is usually my third Mass for the weekend. The 5 PM Mass lacks a regular team of greeters or ushers; some Lectors and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion have told me privately that the 5 PM Sunday Mass is the one they least prefer. Therefore, on the advice of the Pastoral Council, your opinion is sought if we should continue having a 5 PM Mass on Sunday. Please fill out a card you find in your pew and put it in the collection basket by next weekend.

The next Holy Hour for the Rosary and Holy Name Societies will be at 7 PM on Monday, May 13, the Memorial of Our Lady of Fatima. Plans for the evening include praying the rosary and a reenactment of an outdoor procession with a statue of Our Lady of Fatima.

The Primary Elections are next Tuesday, May 21. We have a civic duty to participate in our democracy and to choose people to represent us in government. In the days leading up to an election, certain advocacy groups attempt to distribute campaign literature or voter guides on church property and parking lots. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB), the Pennsylvania Catholic Conference (PCC) and the Archdiocese of Philadelphia have strict guidelines as to what literature may or may not be made available and distributed on church property. Please know that if you find any other literature distributed on parish property, including the parish parking lot, it was done without the permission, consent, or approval of the archdiocese and me as your pastor.

Our parish is hosting a Theology on Tap next Wednesday, May 22 at Taphouse 23, 266 E. 4th Street in Bridgeport, beginning at 7 PM. Theology on Tap is a nationwide evangelization program for young adults 21 to 35 that takes place in a relaxed atmosphere. The topic for the evening is [A Catholic Christian Approach to Using Social Media](#). John Kinuthia, an active member of St. John Chrysostom Parish in Wallingford, PA and a 4th degree member of the Knights of Columbus, will be the presenter. A member of our parish helping to plan the event will speak briefly near the end of the Masses next weekend.

Although PREP for the year has concluded, it is not early to think about next year. Parents are highly encouraged to register their children for the 2019-2020 Year as soon as possible. Registration Fees for next year are \$100 for one child and \$175 for two or more children if paid before June 30. After July 1, the fees increase to \$150 for one child and \$250 for two or more children. Registration forms are available for pick up after Mass in the rear of the church and during the week at the rectory.

Faith Formation

This is the second of a five-part summary of the Decree on the Missionary Activity of the Church (*Ad gentes*) from the Second Vatican Council continues.

Christians are to devote themselves to the education of children and young people, not only by helping to form and develop Christian youth, but also as a public service, especially in developing countries, where there is the need for improved living conditions and the uplifting human dignity. Christians are to take part in aiding efforts to eliminate famine, ignorance, disease, and poverty, and to secure peace in the world.

A person who comes to faith in Christ Jesus is to do so of his or her own free will and not by coercion, allurements, or deception. The Council Fathers desire specific liturgical guidelines whereby a person who comes to faith in Christ Jesus through missionary activity can become a fully initiated member of the Church. What they propose eventually became what we know today as the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, or RCIA.


One who has freely accepted Christ is to be admitted to the catechumenate, a training period in the Christian life. The catechumen (as he or she is called) is to be properly instructed in the Catholic faith and the practice of Gospel morality. Through other liturgical rites held at successive intervals, the catechumen is to be introduced into the life of faith, of liturgy, and of love. The liturgies of Lent are to be restored so the catechumen's heart may be properly disposed to celebrate the solemn ceremonies of the Easter Vigil during which he or she is reborn through Baptism.

Priests, catechists, and the entire faith community are to be involved in the work of Christian initiation so that catechumens may know and feel from the very beginning of their spiritual journey to faith in the Church that they belong to a community. Since the life of the church is apostolic, catechumens should also help to spread the Gospel and build up the Church. Catechumens are joined to the Church by the formal declaration they make through a liturgical rite of their intention to become baptized in the faith. The Decree wanted to make clear that this gives catechumens a juridical status in the church, one that ought to be clearly defined in a revision of the Code of Canon Law.



Movie with Meaning

Come join us for this month's viewing and discussion of *Hacksaw Ridge*, a truly remarkable and moving film about unimaginable courage in the face of impossible odds. It is the true story of Desmond Doss who, in Okinawa during the bloodiest battle of WWII, saved 75 men without firing or carrying a gun. He was the only American soldier in WWII to fight on the front lines without a weapon, as he believed that war was justified, but killing was nevertheless wrong. He served as an army medic, he singlehandedly evacuated the wounded from behind enemy lines. Doss was the first conscientious objector to ever be awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor.
