Dear Friends,

This is the last weekend for registered parishioners to pick up their envelope containing a booklet of Catholic prayers and general information as well as letters announcing a celebration of our 5 years as a parish and an invitation to participate in electronic communications from the parish.

The Primary Elections take place Tuesday, May 21. We have a civic duty to participate in our democracy and to choose people to represent us in government. In the days leading up to an election, certain advocacy groups attempt to distribute campaign literature or voter guides on church property and parking lots. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB), the Pennsylvania Catholic Conference (PCC) and the Archdiocese of Philadelphia have strict guidelines as to what literature may or may not be made available and distributed on church property. Please know that any other literature or voter guides you may find in the parish parking lot after Mass or elsewhere on parish property was placed there without the permission, consent, or approval of the archdiocese and me as your pastor.

A member of our parish helping to plan our initial Theology on Tap, scheduled for Wednesday, May 22, will be speaking briefly near the end of the Masses this weekend. More information about this evangelization program is elsewhere in today's bulletin.

Requests for Announced Masses (those made for a specific day and time) during the last six months of 2019 are being accepted at the parish office beginning Tuesday, May 28. By way of reminder, the Church requires one Mass each weekend and Holyday of Obligation to be offered for the people of the parish. Announced Masses requests are filled on a first come basis. It is preferred that announced Mass intention requests be made in person at the parish office during regular business hours. Unannounced Mass intentions, those with no specific day or time requested, can be made at any time. These Masses are offered usually within a short time after the request is made. The parish reserves the right to transfer requests for unannounced Masses to a retired priest or a priest working in other than parish ministry. Due to the large number of requests people make for their announced Masses to be offered either on a Saturday evening or a Sunday, it has become necessary to limit such requests to two per person. Thank you for your understanding.

The Priest Personnel Manual states that in addition to vacation and the annual retreat, a priest is entitled to one day off each week, including an overnight. *It is understood that some adjustment to the pastoral schedule may need to be made in order to accommodate the priest's need for a day off.* In light of this, requests for an 8 AM Mass on days when I am away either for vacation, fulfilling responsibilities as National Chaplain for the First Catholic Slovak Union, or a day off (usually Thursdays) will be put on hold. The parish reserves the right to transfer a weekday Mass intention to another day if circumstances warrant. Thank you for your understanding.

A meeting of the Ministers of Hospitality (greeters, ushers) is planned for Tuesday, May 28 at 7 PM in the Rectory Meeting Room. All current hospitality ministers as well as those who wish to partake in this ministry, are invited to attend.

Decorations for Mother's Day that were placed on gravesites at Saint Augustine Cemetery will be removed beginning Wednesday, May 29.
