Dear Friends,

As was mentioned in last weekend's bulletin, this weekend's collection envelope for Cemetery Maintenance is for offsetting the current, day to day, expenses incurred by the cemetery. The fee for Perpetual Care paid at the time a grave or tomb is purchased goes into a separate fund and cannot be touched until that eventuality many, many years in the future when the cemetery will no longer be able to accept burials or entombments.

Thank you for the \$1,150 that was collected recently for the Campaign for Human Development, the national anti-poverty and social justice program of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops.

The parish office on occasion receives donations in memory of loved ones for the bread and wine used at Mass. Now, arrangements have been made with a local florist for fresh flowers to be placed on either side of the tabernacle in memory of loved ones. With the exception of Christmas, Easter, and during Lent, requests can be made for virtually any weekend. All requests for flowers in the sanctuary are to be made through the parish office. Like the bread and wine memorials, an acknowledgement for the flower memorials will be put in the parish bulletin. A donation of \$75 for each display is requested. With this in mind, it is possible for two flower memorials on the same weekend.

Bernard Gutkowski and Gregory Philips have completed their terms on the Parish Pastoral Council and we thank them for their service. Nomination forms for two positions on the Council are in the parish bulletin today and next week. Please take the opportunity this week to think about whom you would nominate for service on the Council. He or she is to be a registered member, over the age of 18, and has a desire to work for the overall good of the parish. Completed forms can be put in the collection basket or dropped off at the rectory. Deadline for submission is Monday, August 12.

Faith Formation

The Decree on the Ministry and Life of Priests (Presbyterorum ordinis) from the Second Vatican Council was promulgated by Pope Saint Paul VI on December 7, 1965. The Decree was intended for all priests, especially diocesan priests, with suitable adaptations for priests who are in religious communities. This is the first of a four part summary.

By virtue of the Sacrament of Holy Orders, priests are given a special spiritual character and are conformed to Christ in such a way they can act in his person. They are co-workers with bishops in fulfilling the mission of evangelizing the world. The priest's life, work and ministry is to give glory to God and to lead people in the life of grace. He is to be totally dedicated to the work for which the Lord has chosen him. He is to live in this world, but not be conformed to this world. Certain virtues, such as sincerity, goodness of heart, a zealous pursuit of justice, and friendliness, help him to achieve this aim.

A priest is consecrated by God through the ministry of a bishop to act as the Lord's minister in celebrating the sacraments. He also has a primary duty of preaching the Gospel by applying the truth of the Gospel to the particular circumstances of life. As an educator in the faith, a priest is to lead the people entrusted to him individually to a Christian maturity. The Decree warns that beautiful ceremonies or flourishing associations are of little value if they are not directed toward teaching the faithful to possess Christian maturity. A priest has a special obligation to care for the poor and the weak, the sick and the dying. He is to give special attention in his ministry to youth, married couples and parents.

In addition to caring for individual members of the faithful, a pastor is to help form a Christian community, the center and basis of which is the celebration of Holy Mass. A genuine and complete celebration should inspire members of the local community to carry out various forms of charity, to bear witness to Christ in their lives, and to possess a zeal for a missionary activity that shows a link between themselves and the universal church.
