Dear Friends,

Today is the Third World Day of the Poor. In marking this observance, Pope Francis writes:

Scripture constantly speaks of God acting on behalf of the poor. He is the one who “hears” their cry” and “comes to their aid”; he “protects” and “defends” them; he “rescues” and “saves” them... Indeed, the poor will never find God indifferent or silent in the face of their plea. God is the one who renders justice and does not forget (cf. Ps 40:18; 70:6); he is their refuge and he never fails to come to their assistance (cf. Psalm 10:14).

We can build any number of walls and close our doors in the vain effort to feel secure in our wealth, at the expense of those left outside. It will not be that way for ever. The “day of the Lord”, as described by the prophets (cf. Amos 5:18; Isaiah 2-5; Joel 1-3), will destroy the barriers created between nations and replace the arrogance of the few with the solidarity of many. The marginalization painfully experienced by millions of persons cannot go on for long.

Requests for Announced Masses (those made for a specific day and time) during the first six months of 2020 are being accepted beginning Tuesday, December 3. By way of reminder, the church requires one Mass each weekend and Holyday of Obligation to be offered for the people of the parish. Announced Mass requests are filled on a first come basis. A donation of \$10 per Mass is asked at the time of reservation. Due to the large number of requests that are made for an announced Mass to be offered either on a Saturday evening or a Sunday, it has become necessary to limit such requests to two per person. It is preferred that all requests for Mass intentions, both announced and unannounced, be made in person at the parish office during regular business hours.

The Priest Personnel Manual of the archdiocese states that in addition to his vacation and annual retreat, a priest is entitled to one day off each week, including an overnight. It is understood that some adjustment to the pastoral schedule may need to be made in order to accommodate the priest’s need for a day off. Because of this, requests for an 8 AM Mass on weekdays when I am away either for vacation, fulfilling responsibilities as National Chaplain for the First Catholic Slovak Union, or a day off (usually Thursdays) will be put on hold unless a priest is able to come and offer the Mass in my absence. The parish reserves the right to transfer a weekday Mass intention to another day if circumstances warrant. Thank you for your understanding.

In the event inclement weather causes Upper Merion Area School District to either delay the start of the school day or close the schools, morning Masses will be cancelled and the intentions for those Masses will be transferred to the next available day. The safety of everyone, in particular of our seniors who attend Mass regularly on weekdays, is paramount.

Anyone wishing to help with the parish festival being planned for July 2020 is invited to come to a meeting at 7 PM on Monday, November 18, in the parish hall.

Parents of our PREP students are reminded of the session in church at 7 PM on Tuesday, November 19 during which I will conduct a prayer service for them that includes Exposition and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

The next parish Holy Hour will take place this Thursday, November 21 at 7 PM. The Holy Hour will celebrate the Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary and will consist of the praying of the Rosary, Evening Prayer, and Exposition and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. All are invited.

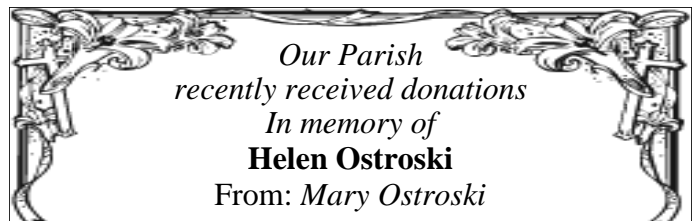

Faith Formation

The Pastoral Constitution of the Church in the Modern World (*Gaudium et spes*) is the last of 16 documents from the Second Vatican Council. Promulgated by Pope Paul VI on December 7, 1965 and addressed to all humanity, the main focus of *Gaudium et spes* is the human person itself, whole and entire, body and soul, heart and conscience, mind and will. What follows is the first of an eleven part summary of this Document.

The Church has always taken upon itself the duty of studying and examining the contemporary world and interpreting the signs of the times in the light of the Gospel. The world of the 1960's is full of contradictions. Humanity enjoys a great abundance of wealth, resources and economic power, yet, on the other hand, huge numbers of people live in hunger and poverty. So many have an understanding of freedom, and at the same time there are countless others who are victims of new forms of social and psychological slavery. There is a clear awareness of global unity and interdependence and, at the same time, political, social, economic, racial and ideological disputes still continue, and with the peril of war. More are having a personal and explicit adherence to faith, yet a growing numbers of people are abandoning the practice of their faith or denying God.

The Constitution identifies other issues present in the 1960's, all of which can be summed up in the word change. Seemingly everything was undergoing change, from the family to the neighborhood, to society itself. Changes in attitudes and in human structures led to both identifying and questioning traditionally accepted values, especially among young people.

Disparity is another word used to describe the world scene at this time. The gap between wealthy and less influential nations as well as the inequality between men and women, the races, the hungry and the well-fed, the wealthy and the poor, was becoming more pronounced. The "have-nots" were beginning to aggressively demand those benefits they judged themselves to be deprived.

This Document offers Christ as the answer to all these situations and declares three teachings the Church firmly believes and upholds. Jesus offers all humanity the grace and strength to measure up to its supreme destiny. The key, focal point and goal of the human race and human history can be found in Jesus. There are many realities which do not change and have their ultimate foundation in Christ.

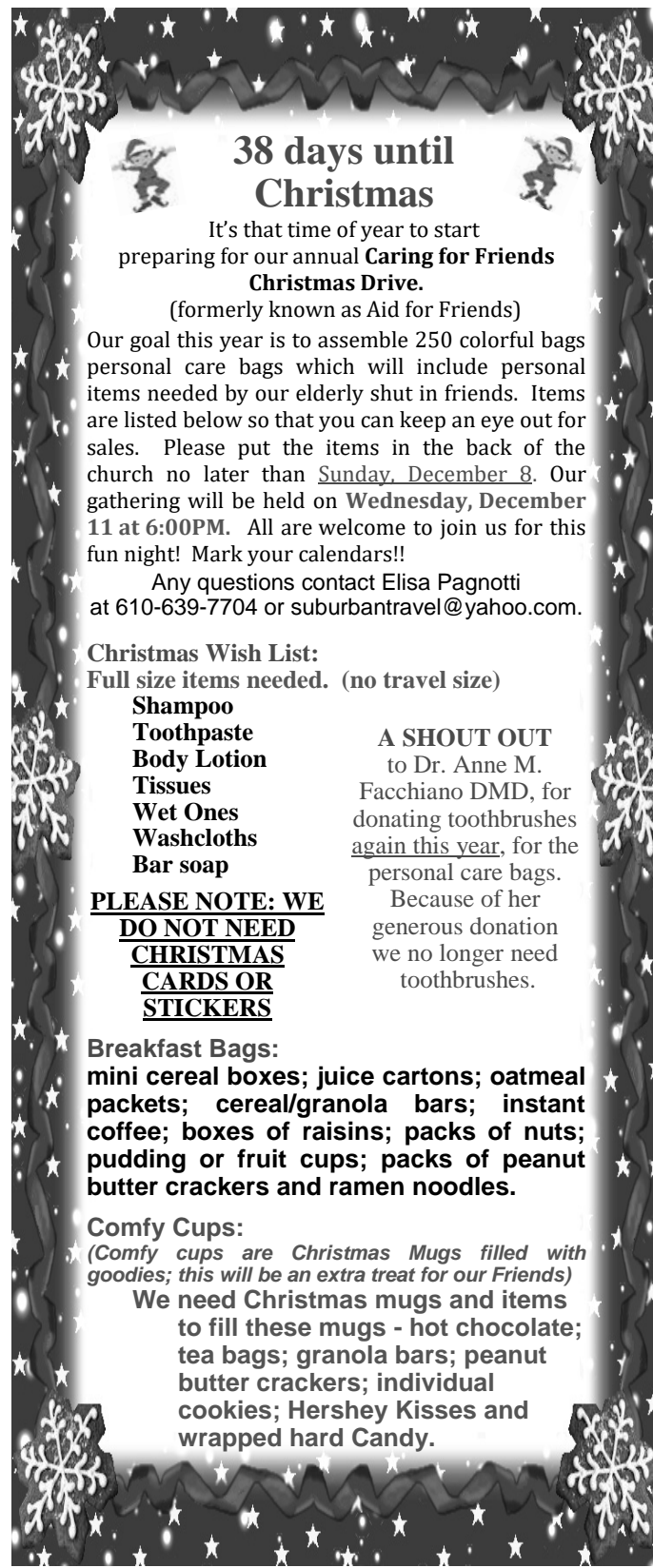
