Dear Friends,

Today is the First Sunday of Advent, the first day of the Liturgical Year. You will notice a switch in missalettes has been made to Breaking Bread. Breaking Bread has a wider variety of hymns than Heritage Missal, the missalette we were using. Both Breaking Bread and Heritage Missal come from the same company.

The priests of the archdiocese assemble each year with the archbishop at Saint Charles Borromeo Seminary at the beginning of Advent for a day of prayer and reflection on the Sacred Priesthood. The 2019 Day of Sanctification for Priests is Monday, December 2. Please pray for all priests of the archdiocese, especially this weekend and on Monday, with the following prayer from the Roman Missal:

*Lord our God, who in governing your people
make use of the ministry of Priests,
grant to these men
a persevering obedience to your will,
so that by their ministry and life
they may gain glory for you in Christ.
Who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
one God, for ever and ever. Amen.*

Requests for Announced Masses (those made for a specific day and time) during the first six months of 2020 will be accepted beginning Tuesday, December 3. Church law requires one Mass each weekend and Holyday of Obligation to be reserved for the people of the parish. Announced Masses requests are filled on a first come basis. A donation of \$10 per Mass is asked at the time of reservation. Due to the large number of requests that are made for an announced Mass to be offered either on a Saturday evening or a Sunday, it has become necessary to limit such requests to two per person.

The Priest Personnel Manual of the archdiocese states that in addition to his vacation and annual retreat, a priest is entitled to one day off each week, including an overnight. It is understood that some adjustment to the pastoral schedule may need to be made in order to accommodate the priest's need for a day off. Because of this, requests for an 8 AM Mass on days when I know I am away either for vacation, fulfilling responsibilities as National Chaplain for the First Catholic Slovak Union, or a day off (usually Thursdays) will be put on hold unless there is a change in my schedule. The parish reserves the right to transfer a weekday Mass intention to another day if circumstances warrant. Thank you for your understanding.

Office hours at the parish this Thursday, December 5, will be 9 AM to 12 noon.

Since next Sunday, December 8, is the Second Sunday in Advent this year, the observance of the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary is transferred to Monday, December 9. The Solemnity is not a Holyday of Obligation this year. Both the parish and Saint Augustine Catholic Cemetery offices will be closed on Monday, December 9.

Saint Charles Borromeo Seminary's 32nd Annual Open House and Christmas Concert will be held next Sunday, December 8th. Beginning at 1 PM, visitors can tour the campus and art collection including the international Christmas Crèche display and Papal artifacts from the 2015 Apostolic visit. The Christmas Concert featuring the musicians and choir of Saint Charles Borromeo Seminary begins at 4 PM in the Chapel of Saint Martin of Tours. All are welcome to attend. There will be a free-will offering for a charity to be chosen by the seminarians.

The next monthly Holy Hour will be at 7:30 PM on Wednesday, December 11. Please note the change in starting time to accommodate those participating in the Caring for Friends Christmas Drive. The Holy Hour will be in honor of Our Lady of Guadalupe, Patroness of the Americas and will consist of the praying of the Rosary, Evening Prayer, and Exposition and Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament. All are invited.

Please feel free to take a 2020 calendar home with you after Mass. Also, booklets from the Diocese of Saginaw with spiritual reflections for Advent are available in the back of church.

Dear Friends in Christ,

Soon our parishes will be conducting the collection for the Retirement Fund for Religious. This annual appeal benefits 31,000 elderly Catholic sisters, brothers, and religious order priests—women and men who have consecrated their lives to serving God and the Church. We are blessed to have 74 religious congregations present and serving within the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. These 74 religious congregations represent approximately 2,400 men and women religious. Of this number, over 800 are retired.

With this in mind, many religious communities struggle to provide for their aging members. During the early and mid-twentieth centuries, the Catholic Church in the United States experienced a surge in vocations to religious life, with numbers peaking in the mid-1960's. Care for elderly members was largely provided by younger ones. Over time, however, the number of vocations decreased while lifespans increased. The result is far fewer younger members available to support the retirement and eldercare needs of senior members. In 2018, 68 percent of the religious communities providing data to the National Religious Retirement Office (NRRO) had a median age of 70 or older.

I recognize this is but one of numerous worthy causes in need of assistance, I ask simply ask that you give what you can. In thanksgiving for their faithful service, please join me in supporting the Retirement Fund for Religious and on praying for God's blessing on our nation's elderly religious.

The annual Retirement Fund for Religious collection will be held December 7-8, 2019 in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. The appeal is coordinated by the NRRO.

In addition to sponsoring the annual appeal, the NRRO offers assessment tools, educational programming, services, and resources that promote quality eldercare and help religious communities plan for long-term retirement needs.

I ask prayers for our consecrated religious and encourage support for this national collection scheduled for December 7-8, 2019 in our local parishes. Thank you.

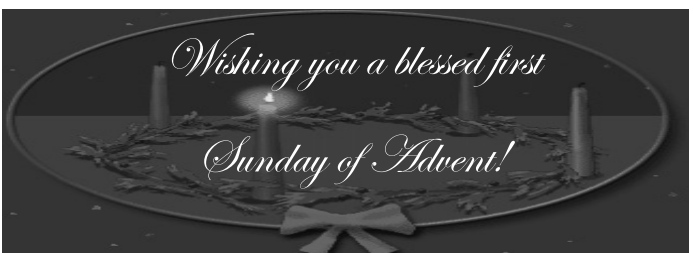
