Dear Friends,

Advent is a time for us to reflect on our relationship with the Lord and to prepare ourselves more thoroughly for his coming again in glory. Seeking God's mercy and through the Sacrament of Penance is a prime means for us to encounter and experience his reconciling love. In addition to the usual times for Confessions on Saturday afternoons, Confessions will also be heard on Friday, December 20 at both 1 PM and 6 PM; Saturday, December 21 at 11 AM; and Monday, December 23 at 1 PM and 7 PM.

The Mass schedule for Christmas has been mailed to your homes. It is common knowledge that the 4:00 PM Mass on Christmas Eve draws the largest attendance of any Mass throughout the year. Last year the church was not able to accommodate about 100 people and they instead attended Christmas Eve Mass at 4:15 PM in the parish social hall. I strongly suggest that everyone wishing to attend Christmas Eve Mass in church to arrive and be seated by 3:45 PM. Our ushers will direct people arriving after this time to the parish social hall for Mass at 4:15 PM. Again, this measure is taken to prevent overcrowding in the church and with everyone's safety in mind. Thank you for your understanding.

The collection for Christmas Flowers was \$1,801 and \$745 was received in the Immaculate Conception envelopes. Your generosity is deeply appreciated.

Everyone is encouraged to be on time for the start of Mass. A good number of people arrived late last weekend for the 10:15 AM and 5 PM Masses. I realize that situations arise which may cause people to be late, but, for some reason or reasons, many were entering church last weekend while the Scriptures were being proclaimed. Thank you in advance for your efforts to be present and on time for Mass each weekend.

With the "Cold and Flu" season upon us, we can do two things to help minimize the potential spread of a virus causing sickness. For the exchange of the Sign of Peace, you can give a simple nod of the head to the people around you. Also, those not feeling well are strongly urged to refrain from receiving the Precious Blood.

Thank you for your generous response in taking tags from the parish's Giving Tree and bringing back gifts to be given to those in need. We can be sure that the agencies receiving these gifts deeply appreciate your acts of love and charity.

Please feel free to take a 2020 calendar home with you after Mass. Also, booklets from the Diocese of Saginaw with spiritual reflections for Advent are available in the back of church.

Christmas wafers (oplatky) for the traditional Christmas Eve dinner eaten in many of our homes are available in the sacristy after Mass and at the parish office during regular business hours. A donation is requested. Also, kolacky will be on sale after the Masses next weekend in the Rectory Meeting Room. Nut, poppy seed, apricot, lekvar and raspberry rolls will be available for \$15 a roll.

By way of reminder, in the event inclement weather causes Upper Merion Area School District to either delay the start of the school day or close the schools, morning Masses will be cancelled and the intentions for those Masses will be transferred to the next available day. The safety of everyone, particularly our seniors who attend Mass regularly on weekdays, is paramount.

Faith Formation

This is the fourth of a series summarizing the Pastoral Constitution of the Church in the Modern World from the Second Vatican Council.

Every person possesses a rational soul and is created in God's likeness. Every person has the same nature and origin. Every person has been redeemed by Christ and enjoys the same divine calling and destiny. But not every person is the same regarding physical power, or intellectual and moral development. With respect to the fundamental rights of person, every type of social or cultural discrimination, whether based on sex, race, color, social condition, language or religion, is to be overcome and eradicated as contrary to God's intent.

Only God, who created human beings in his image and likeness and redeemed us from sin, provides the most adequate answer, Jesus. Whoever follows after Jesus, the perfect human being, becomes more of a human being.

Christians are called upon to conscientiously carry out their earthly responsibilities through a daily living of the Gospel. It is a mistake to think that this can be neglected. A more serious error of the day is people believing they can separate their faith life from their day to day life. The Christian who neglects duties toward neighbor and God places his or her eternal salvation in jeopardy.

Marriage and the family is the next major topic undertaken. The intention here is to give guidance and support to Christians and others who are trying to preserve the holiness and foster the dignity of marriage, which is being torn apart because of two phenomena taking place in the modern world. The presence of divorce, polygamy, and free love run contrary to the very nature of marriage as an exclusive, faithful, permanent union between a man and a woman. Also, excessive self-love, the worship of pleasure, and illicit practices to prevent the conception of new human life are against the traditional belief that married love is to be selfless and life-giving.

The Church's traditional teaching regarding marriage are affirmed. God established married life and love, and endowed it with various benefits and purposes, among which are having children and educating them. By means of their irrevocable personal consent, a man and a woman enter into a relationship which, by divine will and in the eyes of society, is lasting.

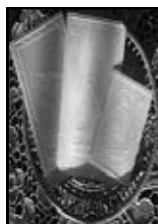
