Dear Friends,

On behalf of the parish staff, I wish each of you and your loved ones a Blessed, Safe, and Merry Christmas.

We are blessed at Sacred Heart Parish with several people who selflessly offer their time and talent for the good of the parish. On behalf of all the parishioners, I am grateful to everyone who helped to decorate the church and sanctuary as well as set up the manger scene. My gratitude also goes to all who clean the church for Christmas or spent hours practicing hymns to enhance our experience of worship. Thank you for sharing your gifts with the entire parish.

Confessions will be heard on Monday, December 23 at 1 PM and 7 PM.

The Mass schedule for Christmas has been mailed to your homes. It is common knowledge that the 4:00 PM Mass on Christmas Eve draws the largest attendance of any Mass throughout the year. Last year the church was not able to accommodate about 100 people. They attended Christmas Eve Mass at 4:15 PM in the parish social hall. I strongly suggest that everyone wishing to attend Christmas Eve Mass in church to arrive and be seated by 3:45 PM. Our ushers will direct people arriving after this time to the parish social hall for Mass at 4:15 PM. Again, this measure is taken to prevent overcrowding in the church and with everyone's safety in mind. Thank you for your understanding.

The parish and cemetery office are closed on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day. The cemetery office will also be closed on Thursday, December 26. The offices will be closed on Wednesday, January 1, 2020. PREP is on hiatus for the Christmas holiday and will resume on Sunday, January 5, 2020.

A large 'thank you' is extended to the 40 plus adults and children who came to the parish hall earlier this month for our parish's ministry to Caring for Friends. Close to 300 bags of personal care items were prepared. The bags were distributed to people in our area that are homebound and receive meals through Caring for Friends. Thank you also to all who donated the soap, shampoo, tea bags, toothpaste, snacks, socks, and other items that were put in the bags. God bless everyone who participated in this work.

Christmas wafers (oplatky) for the traditional Christmas Eve dinner eaten in many of our homes are available in the sacristy after Mass and at the parish office during regular business hours. A donation is requested. Also, kolacky will be on sale after the Masses in the Rectory Meeting Room. Nut, poppy seed, apricot, lekvar and raspberry rolls will be available for \$15 a roll.

The weekly Stewardship Report for last weekend is not in today's bulletin due to an early deadline. The report will be included in a future bulletin.

Please feel free to take a 2020 calendar home with you after Mass.

Thank you to all who continue to support the 2019 Catholic Charities Appeal. The Catholic Foundation for Greater Philadelphia, the body charged with fund raising for the archdiocese, reports that 147 donors from our parish have given and pledged \$13,847. This represents 81% of the parish's \$17,000 goal.

As a friendly reminder, it would be a tremendous help to those who count the collection if the flaps on the offering envelopes were sealed by just moistening the flap. No tape or staples, please.

Faith Formation

This is the fifth of a series summarizing the Pastoral Constitution of the Church in the Modern World from the Second Vatican Council.

In marriage, man and woman render mutual help and service to each other through an intimate union of their persons. Through this union they come to experience the meaning of their oneness and strive to attain it each day. This intimate union and the good of children impose total fidelity on the spouses and offers rationale for an unbreakable oneness between them.

Authentic married love is governed and enriched by Christ's redeeming power and the saving activity of the Church. For this reason, Christian spouses have a special sacrament by which they are strengthened and consecrated in the duties and dignity of their state. By virtue of Matrimony, they are penetrated with the spirit of Christ as they fulfil their conjugal and family obligations and responsibilities.

Actions within marriage by which a couple are united intimately and chastely are noble and worthy. Divine law reveals and protects the integral meaning of conjugal love. Spouses should be mindful they are to be governed according to a conscience conformed to that divine law and follow the church's teaching office when she authentically interprets that law in light of the Gospel. Marriage by its very nature is an unbreakable and indissoluble bond between a man and woman.

Human life must be safeguarded with the greatest care from the moment of conception. Abortion is called an unspeakable crime, and so, too, infanticide.

It is at this point that the Constitution addresses artificial means of preventing conception and does so in the context of a term from moral theology, the "moral act." A moral act is one which is either to be done as good and holy or avoided as evil and sinful. Acts of conjugal love are moral acts and are to be honored with great reverence. Since there is no contradiction between divine laws pertaining the transmission of human life and those pertaining authentic conjugal love, this moral act must be determined as other moral acts, namely, by objective standards and not by subjective intentions or motives. What this means is that it is not permitted for members of the Church to undertake methods of preventing conception that are contrary to Church teaching.
