Dear Friends,

Today is the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord, a day that celebrates the true meaning of Christmas, namely, that God, in manifesting His love for the whole world by becoming a human being, offers the gift of eternal salvation through His Son to people of every race, language, and way of life. We are Christians, followers of Christ, by virtue of our belief in this message and our Baptism. As his followers, we can never really stop learning about Jesus, His Church, and our Catholic faith. This is the primary motivation behind my efforts to provide some Adult Faith Formation in the parish bulletin on a regular basis. Today's Faith Formation article is a summary of 9 Days for Life, an initiative of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops in association with the annual "Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children" on January 22.

The parish Holy Hour this month will be on Thursday, January 23, which is the eve of the annual March for Life in Washington, DC. The Holy Hour consists of praying of the Rosary, Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, Evening Prayer, and Benediction. All are invited to attend.

Flowers and other decorations placed on gravesites for the Christmas holiday at St. Augustine Catholic Cemetery will be removed beginning the week of January 19.

Due to an early deadline for this bulletin, the last week's Stewardship Report will be made available at a future date.

Refurbishment on two of the church's stained-glass windows is planned to begin shortly. Outdoor frames are to be stripped of paint, inspected for signs of damage and replaced as needed, and repainted. New and improved protective glass specially treated to withstand ultraviolet rays from sunlight is to be installed. The stained-glass windows themselves will be removed, inspected for signs of warping, cleaned, and reset. It is hoped that the work on these two windows will be finished by Easter. Refurbishment of all the stained-glass windows will take a few years to complete, since only a couple of windows will be worked on at a time.

Statements are available only to registered members of the parish (those who receive and use their parish envelopes) and should be available by January 31.

Today, January 5, is the Feast of Saint John Neumann, who was the fourth bishop of Philadelphia. The Friends of Saint John Neumann has been established by the archdiocesan Office for Life and Family to assist Catholic men who struggle with addiction to pornography. The Friends have weekly meetings and a 12 + 2 Step Program. Further information about both can be found by either going to their website, fsjnphilly.org, or by calling 215-490-4660 (confidentiality assured).

The "Cold and Flu" season is upon us. We can do two things to help minimize the potential spread of the virus causing sickness. For the exchange of the Sign of Peace, you can give a simple nod of the head to the people around you. Also, it is strongly suggested that those not feeling well to please refrain from receiving the Precious Blood.

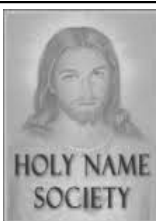

CHALKING THE DOORS

20 + C + M + B + 20

The Feast of the Epiphany has, for centuries, marked the occasion for a time-honored Christian tradition of "chalking the doors."

The letters represent the initials of the Magi - Caspar, Malchior and Balthazar - who came to visit Jesus in His first home. They also abbreviate the Latin phrase, *Christus mansionem benedicat*: "May Christ bless the house." The "+" signs represent the cross as a reminder that with the Incarnation there is also a Paschal Mystery. The numbers are split to mark the beginning and end of the current year. The chalk, a product of clay, recalls the human nature taken by the Eternal Word of God in the womb of the Virgin Mary.

This inscription is performed as a request for Christ to bless those homes so marked and that He stay with those who dwell therein throughout the entire year.

Practicing traditions like "chalking the doors" helps us to live our Faith more concretely and serves as an outward sign of our dedication to Our Lord. Seeing the symbols over our doors can help to remind us, while passing in and out on our daily routines, that our homes and all those who dwell there belong to Christ.

Packets of blessed chalk and incense are located near the crèche for you to take home.

Day One: Tuesday, January 21, 2020

Intention: For an end to the tragic practice of abortion.

Prayers: *Our Father, 3 Hail Marys, Glory Be*

Reflection: Abortion tragically rejects the truth that every life is a good and perfect gift, deserving of protection. May our culture experience the power of God's transforming love, that all eyes may be opened to the incredible beauty of every human life.

Act of Reparation: Take a break from television and movies today.

Day Two: Wednesday, January 22, 2020

Intention: For all unborn children to be protected in law and welcomed in love.

Prayers: *Our Father, 3 Hail Marys, Glory Be*

Reflection: Today is the 47th anniversary of Roe vs. Wade and is also the "Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children" in the Church in the United States. With trust that the Lord hears our prayer, the Church comes together today to pray for the protection of all unborn children and to make reparation for abortion.

Act of Reparation: Fast from one meal today.

Day Three: Thursday, January 23, 2020

Intention: For every expectant mother to receive compassionate care and support as she nurtures the life in her womb.

Prayers: *Our Father, 3 Hail Marys, Glory Be*

Reflection: Like the Blessed Mother, women who unexpectedly become pregnant often face significant challenges. They, too, are called to place their trust in God and faithfully respond to His gift of new life. And we are called to walk with them in their time of need.

Act of Reparation: Pray the Angelus today.

Day Four: Friday, January 24, 2020

Intention: For expectant fathers to lovingly support the mothers of their children in welcoming new life.

Prayers: *Our Father, 3 Hail Marys, Glory Be*

Reflection: Women often choose abortion because they do not have the support of the child's father, or – even worse – the father of the child pressures her to make the decision to abort. We pray that expectant father will find courage in the example of Saint Joseph, who embraced the role of father amid difficult circumstances, and offer loving, life-affirming support to the mothers of their children.

Act of Reparation: Give up sleeping on your pillow, or even your bed, tonight. Offer this small sacrifice for the intention that expectant fathers would courageously answer their call to support both mother and child.

Day Five: Saturday, January 25, 2020

Intention: For each person suffering from the loss of a child through abortion to find hope and healing in Christ.

Prayers: *Our Father, 3 Hail Marys, Glory Be*

Reflection: After more than four decades of legalized abortion, many children's lives have been ended, and many parents and family members suffer that loss—often in silence. Yet God's greatest desire is to forgive. Be assured that it is never too late to seek God's forgiveness in the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

Act of Reparation: Abstain from meat today. If you are already abstaining from meat today, skip your favorite snack, too.

Day Six: Sunday, January 26, 2020

Intention: For expectant mothers choosing adoption to receive grace and support in embracing this loving option.

Prayers: *Our Father, 3 Hail Marys, Glory Be*

Reflection: Adoption can be inaccurately perceived as abandonment. Rather, mothers who place their children for adoption are exemplifying the sacrificial love of Christ on the Cross in choosing to do what is best for their children, even at great cost to themselves. Like Christ, they pour out their bodies and souls for the sake of another.

Act of Reparation: Give up your favorite snack for the day.

Day Seven: Monday, January 27, 2020

Intention: For all who support or participate in abortion to experience a conversion of heart to seek and receive the Lord's boundless mercy.

Prayers: *Our Father, 3 Hail Marys, Glory Be*

Reflection: From creation, disregard for human life has continued to spread. When we, like Cain, allow sin to find a place in our hearts, we become blind to the truth. Sometimes this blindness might be so deep that we fail to recognize the undeniable humanity of unborn children. But we know that "life, especially human life, belongs only to God: for this reason whoever attacks human life, in some way attacks God himself" (*Gospel of Life, 9*).

Act of Reparation: Ask God today for the grace to be extra joyful and share the light of Christ with those most in need of His love and mercy.

Day Eight: Tuesday, January 28, 2020

Intention: For civic leaders to work for the protection of all human life, in every stage and circumstance.

Prayers: *Our Father, 3 Hail Marys, Glory Be*

Reflection: The Declaration of Independence boldly affirms that the first among our inalienable rights is the right to life, given to us by the Creator. Yet the right to life is today threatened and often denied, particularly at the moments when life is most fragile. Our laws should protect life, but currently our laws abandon the most vulnerable and violate our nation's core principles. Through our own prayer, witness, and civic participation, we can encourage our leaders to truly answer their call to protect the rights of all people.

Act of Reparation: Sacrifice some of your free time to do a small act of service, such as making breakfast for a family member, writing a note of encouragement for a coworker, or praying for the intentions of a friend.


Day Nine: Wednesday, January 29, 2020


Intention: For all who defend life find strength and renewal in the Holy Spirit.

Prayers: *Our Father, 3 Hail Marys, Glory Be*

Reflection: God has carefully, tenderly created every person in His own image and likeness, to be in a loving relationship with Himself. Christ calls us to embrace and uphold the unconditional dignity of every human life. May the Holy Spirit continually renew us as we strive to faithfully defend God's gift of life.

Act of Reparation: Abstain from caffeinated beverages today.
