Parents are asked not to make any celebratory arrangements until a Baptism date is confirmed by our Rectory staff.

Please speak to Father Nasta if you or a family member wish to receive the Sacrament of the Sick. It is always appropriate to receive this Sacrament before surgery, during a serious illness or in the final stages of life.

Today is the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. This feast presents an opportunity to remind everyone of the requirements for a person to be eligible to act as a sponsor (godparent) at either Baptism or Confirmation. The requirements are listed elsewhere in today's bulletin.

Poinsettias that were used to decorate the sanctuary for Christmas are available to be taken home after Mass this weekend. Flowers and other decorations placed on gravesites for the Christmas holiday at St. Augustine Catholic Cemetery will be removed beginning next week.

Requests for statements detailing your 2019 contributions to Sacred Heart Church can be made by sending an e-mail to the parish office (unitedinthesacredheart@aol.com) or by calling the parish office during regular business hours. Statements are available only to registered members of the parish (those who receive and use their parish envelopes) and should be available by January 31.

The 2019 Christmas Collection amounted to \$18,503 and the collection for the January 1 holyday honoring Mary, Mother of God was \$2,503. Thank you so much for your generous support of our parish.

AFIRE (Active Faith Implementing Relief in the Epidemic) is a faith-based movement designed to bring healing, hope, resources, advocacy, and transformational action to families and communities struggling with addiction. A healing blessing will be offered after Mass. Father David Ousley, Pastor of St. John the Baptist Church, is the celebrant. All are invited.

The parish Holy Hour this month will be on Thursday, January 23, which is the eve of the annual March for Life in Washington, DC. The Holy Hour consists of praying of the Rosary, Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, Evening Prayer, and Benediction. All are invited to attend.

The success of last month's trip to the Sight and Sound Theatre to see "The Miracle of Christmas" has prompted another trip to see "Queen Esther" on Thursday, April 30. A brochure with more information will be in next weekend's parish bulletin.

Several 6:30 AM and 8 AM Masses on weekdays remain available for specific intentions. Requests for unannounced Mass intentions, those offered on an unspecified day and/or location, are also being accepted. 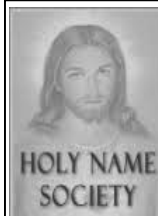

LIFE EMPOWERS: PRO-LIFE IS PRO-WOMAN

The Feast of the Baptism of the Lord presents an opportunity to offer as a reminder the following requirements for a person to be able to act as a sponsor (godparent) at Baptism.

1. *Only one sponsor is required at a Baptism, although it is customary to have two. No more than two sponsors are permitted and they are not to be of the same sex.*
2. *A sponsor is to be at least 16 years of age and is to have received the Sacraments of Confirmation and Holy Eucharist.*
3. *A sponsor is to be a living witness of his/her Catholic faith. This means he/she attends Mass on the weekend and receives the sacraments on a regular basis. It also means that if married, he/she was married according to the laws of the Catholic Church.*
4. *A non-practicing Catholic may be admitted as a sponsor only if the pastor or minister of the sacrament can determine that the person is in the process of returning to the regular practice of the faith.*
5. *A person baptized in another Christian community can act as a Christian witness at a Baptism, but only together with a Catholic sponsor.*
6. *A Catholic who has not been confirmed or received Holy Eucharist, has abandoned the Catholic Church by formally joining a non-Catholic faith community, was married outside the Catholic Church (without proper dispensation), or is living in a relationship that simulates marriage (cohabitation or domestic partnership) may not be a sponsor.*
7. *Neither a person who has left the Catholic Church by enrollment in a non-Catholic faith community nor an unbaptized person may serve as a Christian witness at a Baptism.*

A Catholic asked to be a sponsor at a Baptism (or Confirmation) taking place in another church is normally required to obtain a Certificate of Eligibility from the parish in which he/she currently resides and is registered. The Certificate attests to the fact that the one asked to be a sponsor is a Catholic who practices his/her faith. The Certificate should be obtained as soon as one is asked to be a sponsor and presented to the church where the Baptism is taking place well in advance of the date for the Baptism.

The eligibility requirements that are underlined also apply to a person who is asked to be a sponsor at Confirmation.

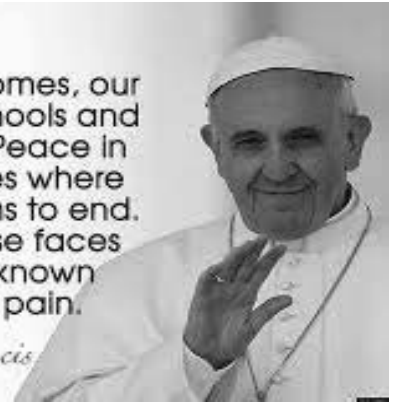
