By way of reminder, as a minimal obligation all persons over the age of 14 are seriously bound to abstain from eating meat on the Fridays of Lent. Stations of the Cross are prayed at 7:00 PM on the Fridays of Lent.

Regarding the obligation to abstain from meat on the Fridays of Lent, an article in the newspaper last week raised an interesting question. What about meatless hamburgers? They are made from plants, but they look like burgers, have the consistency of burgers, and (supposedly) taste like burgers. Is it permissible for Catholics to consume them on Fridays of Lent? Since they are not made from meat, the technical answer is yes. However, quoting the Director of Divine Worship from the Archdiocese of Chicago, "you risk losing the whole spirit of [abstaining from meat]." Therefore, the best answer is this: Be guided by your conscience.

Archbishop Pérez will be celebrating Mass at St. Helena Church, 1489 DeKalb Pike, Blue Bell, PA 19422 at 7 PM on Wednesday, May 6, 2020 for the people in Deaneries 5 and 6. Sacred Heart parishioners are invited to attend.

Faith Formation

March 25, the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord, is the 25th anniversary of Pope St. John Paul II's landmark encyclical *Evangelium Vitae*, the Gospel of Life, in which he offers clear and definitive teaching on a variety of issues concerning human life. This is the second of a six-part series summarizing the encyclical.

Chapter 1 – Present Day Threats to Human Life

John Paul begins this chapter by retelling the story of Cain and Abel from Genesis 4. God's question to Cain, "What have you done?" (Genesis 4:10) is addressed to us today to make us realize the extent and seriousness of the attacks being made against life, to make one discover the causes, and to ponder seriously the consequences.

He sees as these causes the prevailing viewpoint that attacks against life in the earliest and final stages are not seen as crimes, but rather as "rights" that the state gives, and that these "rights" enjoy legal recognition and are enabled by health care personnel.

We are confronted with a structure of sin characterized by the emergence of a culture of death which is fostered by a society excessively concerned with efficiency. This argument is used to justify abortion and contraception, which John Paul describes as "fruits of the same tree."

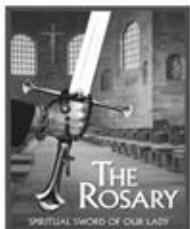
From the moral point of view, John Paul II calls them specifically different evils. Whereas abortion destroys the life of a human being, is disposed to the virtue of justice and directly violates "You shall not kill," contraception contradicts the full truth of the sexual act and proper expression of conjugal love, and is opposed to the virtue of chastity in marriage.

At this point the pope gives a teaching on the use of pre-natal diagnosis. It is licit when used to identify a medical treatment needed by the unborn child. It is illicit when used to justify an abortion.

John Paul then addresses euthanasia and mentions two factors that influence a decision to end the life of one who is terminally ill. First, modern culture sees suffering as an evil, to be eliminated at all costs. Second, people believe they can take control of life and death by taking decisions into their own hands.

He notes a paradox in the modern world regarding human rights. In an age when the rights of the individual person are solemnly proclaimed and the value of life is publicly affirmed, the right to life at the more significant moments of life (birth and death) is being denied.
