Dear Friends,

In response to the spread of sickness throughout the world, the Office for Divine Worship issued directives last week for the reception of Holy Communion. The Precious Blood is not to be distributed at Mass. Also, a simple nod of the head to the people around you would suffice for giving each other the Sign of Peace.

The parish bulletin has contained a message regularly concerning the availability of Mass intentions for the weekday 6:30 AM Masses. From this week until the end of June, only nine (9) 6:30 AM Masses have intentions. There are sixty-three (63) other 6:30 AM Masses until the end of June that remain available. It is obvious that the supply of weekday Mass intentions at 6:30 AM is far outweighing the demand. Continuing this Mass on weekdays beyond the end of June will depend upon the filling of the current vacancies. There are also several openings for intentions for the 8 AM Mass on weekdays from now until the end of June; all weekend Masses until then have already been reserved. Mass Intentions for July through December of 2020 will begin to be accepted near the end of May. Mass intentions are accepted at the parish office during regular business hours and the donation is \$10 per Mass.

The monthly parish Holy Hour consisting of praying the Rosary, Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, Evening Prayer and Benediction, is taking place beginning at 7 PM this Tuesday, March 17, the Commemoration of Saint Patrick. All are invited. Confessions will be heard before the Holy Hour at 6:30 PM.

Thank you for your generosity in the recent second collection supporting the Archdiocese for Military Services that came to \$1,647.

Everyone over the age of 14 is reminded of the serious obligation as Catholics to refrain from eating meat each Friday of Lent. Stations of the Cross is prayed on the Fridays of Lent beginning at 7 PM.

In addition to my continuing faith formation series summarizing Pope St. John Paul II's encyclical The Gospel of Life, the unaudited report of parish ordinary income and expenses for the first six months of the current fiscal year is printed elsewhere in today's parish bulletin.

## *Faith Formation*

March 25, the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord, is the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Pope St. John Paul II's landmark encyclical *Evangelium Vitae*, the Gospel of Life, in which he offers clear and definitive teaching on a variety of issues concerning human life. This is the third of a six-part series summarizing the encyclical.

### Chapter 2 – The Christian Message Concerning Life

John Paul reiterates a fundamental truth. Through the words, actions, and very person of Jesus, we are given the possibility of knowing the complete truth concerning the value of human life. Namely, it is to accept and fulfill completely the responsibility of loving, serving, defending, and protecting human life.

All humanity is in the image and likeness of God. God is the sole Lord of life. We cannot do with our lives as we will. Human life and death are, therefore, in the hands of God. As such, human life is sacred, and the sacredness of life gives rise to its inviolability.

The deepest element of God's commandment to protect human life ("You shall not kill") is the requirement for all humanity to show reverence and love for everyone and the life of everyone. This ranges from caring for the life of a brother (blood, some people or foreigner) to showing concern for the stranger, even to point of loving enemies. An enemy ceases to be one for the person obliges to love and do good to that person. The height of this love is to pray for one's enemy. In that way, harmony with God's providential love is achieved.

John Paul II concludes this chapter by offering a reflection on the Cross. For him, the entire Gospel of Life can be seen in and through the Cross. Darkness associated with the culture of death does not overcome the glory of the Cross, which shines forth evermore radiantly and brilliantly and is the meaning, goal and center of all history and every human life. By his death, Jesus sheds light upon the meaning of life and death of every person.
